



Rules of the Road

The following conditions are required for CUA to facilitate a roadside cleanup for any organization.

- Date of intended pickup should be provided to CUA at least 3 weeks prior.
- The chosen stretch of road must be previewed by a CUA project coordinator to determine the number of volunteers needed, the proper staging area, safe parking spots, and distribution of volunteers along roadside for maximum efficiency. Plan on approximately 10 volunteers for each mile.
- A detailed map showing assigned sections will be shared with the organization representative.
- The requesting organization must commit to a minimum number of 8-10 volunteers and confirm their participation for cleanup day. This is necessary to help CUA plan for supplies for the number of volunteers.
- All volunteers must sign a waiver before participating in the cleanup. CUA will provide the needed documents on day of pickup.
- CUA will promote the cleanup campaign with location, date, time and other details on our website and Facebook page to recruit CUA follower/member to assist.
- If need, CUA will create an event flyer for the organization to post or distribute internally.
- One volunteer must commit to provide a pickup truck or trailer to collect the bags from the roadside and deposit in one place on the route for state DOT, or county pickup.
- CUA will provide all supplies needed such as safety vests, pickup sticks, orange bags and water for volunteers. Any other refreshments will be supplied by the organization.
- The sponsoring organization is always welcome to plan additional refreshments or even a fun cookout after the cleanup event.
- All supplies must be returned at the end of the cleanup.
- This is a fun event. We ask that all volunteers be on time, so we can get a group picture that the organization can use, and CUA will post on our website.
